Marine spatial planning is a tool to coordinate physical use and protection of the sea in all its dimensions, to balance the existing interests and to secure a sustainable use of the resources of the sea. PartiSEApate and ARTWEI are two EU projects that focus on how a diversity of stakeholders need to cooperate in marine spatial planning when different interests, roles, cultures, policies etc. meet. In the project there are different pilot areas, Pomerian Bight/ Arkona Basin and Baltic Sea being two of these. The aim is to develop guidance, models and tools for how multilevel governance can be a realization for marine spatial planning, for example in the area shared by Sweden, Germany, Denmark and Poland. In parallel to this, other parts of the project concern work that captures the marine spatial planning structures and processes in the whole of the Baltic Sea Region.
