

- . EU affairs
- Focus on promoting sea transport in the Baltic
- Promoting environmental management in the ports
- . Contributing to the sustainable development of the BSR
- Facilitating contacts with business partners from all around the world





Main findings:

- Ports are expanding
- Ports are relocating (moving from towns/cities)
- Often ports are expanding into the sea direction


However; not much discussion about MSP (probably more at the local/regional level)

Ports of Stockholm Nynäshamn Project




Stockholm-Nynäshamn will be built at Norvikudden as a natural extension of the existing port at Nynäshamn.












